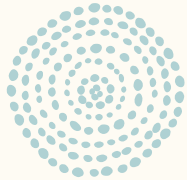






What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program to provide all children the opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.



What does Title I look like in our school?



Our school has a schoolwide Title I program, meaning all students may benefit from the Title I funded resources. Title I services might include support from a Family School Liaison, Learning Coach, Classroom Paraprofessional, Counselor, professional development for teachers, before/after school school tutoring, and classroom resources that enhance the education process in the classroom.

- ❑ **Teachers** understand the needs and concerns of students and parents.
- ❑ **Parents** better understand their child and become more involved in their child's education.

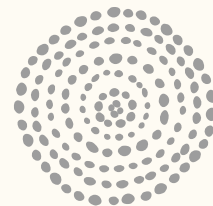

Communication is a two-way process between family and school.

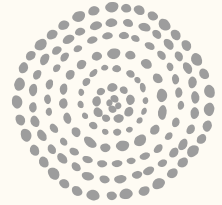
- ★ School notifications may be sent through Canvas, teacher/school newsletters, robocalls, social media, email, mail, school marqueees, conferences, etc...







Ways to Support Your Child
