FLUENCY

Write a story about a sneaky leprechaun. Make sure to write at least 5 sentences. Then read it to a family member.



VOCABULARY

Involve your child in an every day task (ie- running an errand, laundry, mopping the floor, etc.) Talk with your child about the vocabulary surrounding those tasks. (ie-Laundry: detergent, static, stain removal, wrinkles, etc.)

PLACE VALUE

Draw three cards each. Make the biggest numbers you can. The person who has the largest number wins the round. (If you don't have a deck of cards you can use UNO cards.)

Take out a deck of cards. Remove all face cards. Lay cards face down. Draw three cards and find the sum. If the sum is over 20 keep the cards. If the sum is under 20 return them to the deck. Whoever has the most cards wins!
