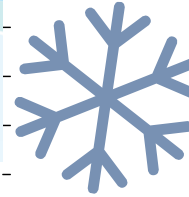
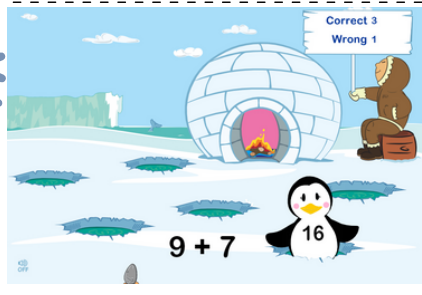
PLACE VALUE

$$6 \times 4 = n$$

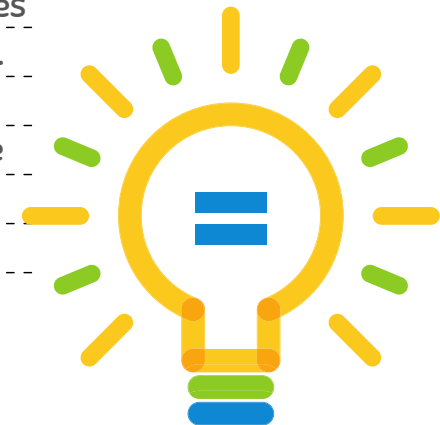
$$6 \times 40 = n$$
