

Summer Reading Attrition

Summer is a time for fun and relaxation, but it's also important for children to continue reading. When children take a long break from reading, they can lose some of the skills they worked hard to build during the school year. This is often called the "summer slide." Even just 15 to 20 minutes of reading a day can help children maintain and improve their reading fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. It keeps their brains active and ready for learning when school starts again.

Reading during the summer doesn't have to feel like homework. Kids can explore books that match their interests—whether it's mystery, fantasy, animals, or graphic novels. Visiting the library, joining a summer reading program, listening to audiobooks in the car, or reading together as a family can make reading fun and part of the daily routine. Encouraging a love of reading now helps children grow into strong, confident readers for life.
