# Weather Vs. Climate

W&C #8: I can differentiate between weather and climate.

## Weather:

- Weather describes the atmospheric conditions at a specific place at a specific point in time
- Weather changes day-to-day. It is generally described in short time frames minutes, hours, days, and weeks.
- At a given location, the weather may be cloudy and rainy one day and clear and sunny the next.



#### Weather:

• The two most important factors to focus on when looking at the weather is the current **temperature** and **precipitation**.



## Climate:

- Climate refers to the statistics of weather. In other words, the average pattern for weather over a period of months, years, decades, or longer in a specific place.
- Scientists use two main factors, average annual precipitation and average annual temperature, to describe the climate of a region.

- It snowed 5 inches last night.
- Weather; recent weather event of snow

- The skies are clearing.
- Weather; current conditions.

- Katrina was the strongest hurricane to hit New Orleans.
- Climate; reference to a weather extreme

- It has never gone above 100 F in the month of May.
- Climate; reference to a weather extreme

- There is a severe thunderstorm watch for the local area.
- Weather; current weather conditions are leading to the potential of severe thunderstorms in the near term.

- The barometric pressure is falling.
- Weather; recent weather change

- It has not rained this month yet.
- Weather; no weather has produced rain this month.

- There is a 40% chance of rain today.
- Weather

- Texas is known for hot and humid weather.
- Climate

- The high is 75∘F on Friday.
- Weather

- Typically rainfall in June will be under 1 inch.
- Climate; reference to typical conditions and a value of typical rainfall.

- The sky is mostly cloudy.
- Weather

- This winter should be colder than normal.
- Climate; compares the expected winter to normal conditions.

- This weekend it is supposed to be sunny.

- The average temperature for April is 55°F
