ECSE Pronouns Lesson: April 2020

Learning Target:

Students will identify correct sentences containing “I” and “me” pronouns.

Background: This is a lesson to teach when to use “I” and “me” pronouns correctly

- Students will learn when to use either “I” or “me”.
- Students will practice saying sentences containing each pronoun.
- Students will identify sentences as correct or incorrect.

Sometimes you don't use your name....

You can say "I"

Or you can say "me"

Use “I” if you are doing or giving something!

Let's practice now!

- I am jumping!
- I am kicking a ball!
- I open my mouth!
- I give mom a kiss!
- I pet the dog (or cat)!



Use “me” if you are getting something or something is done to you!







Let's practice now!

- Dad gives me presents!
- Mom kisses me!
- Teachers help me!
- Dad gives me a high five!
- Mom hugs me!
