## Lesson: May 2020

### **Learning Target:**

Students will review the /p/ phoneme in initial and final word position and learn the sound in medial position.

**Background:** This is a worksheet to practice production of the /p/ sound.

- Students will review productions of /p/ in initial and final position, within short phrases.
- Students will then practice producing the sounds in medial position. They will use apple cutouts to practice.

1. Sing about an apple tree!

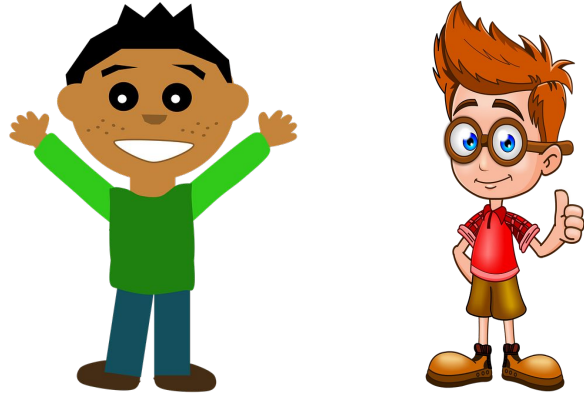

We are ready to start putting the /p/ sound in the middle of words! Great Job!



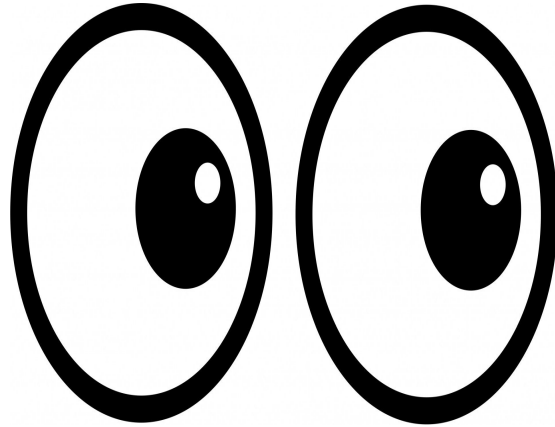
Before we do though, let's practice some of our old words in short phrases. Use the board on the next page to make sentences out of the review words! You can do it!



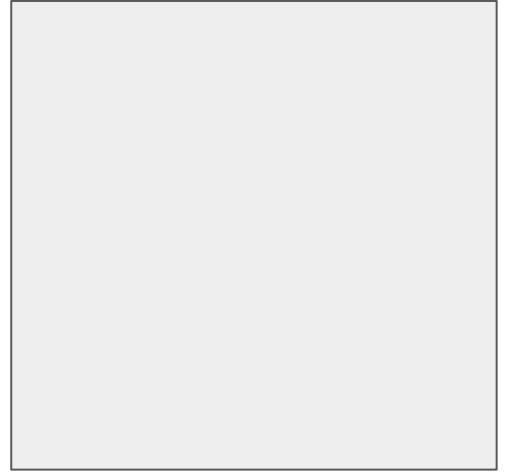

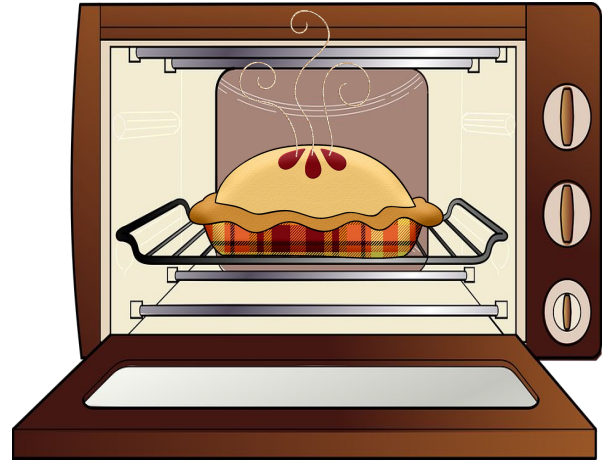


# Time to practice /p/ in the middle of words!

Apples are a delicious fruit! We can eat them by themselves or bake with them!



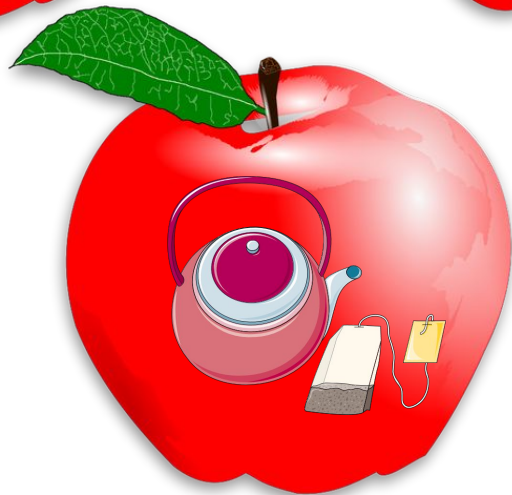
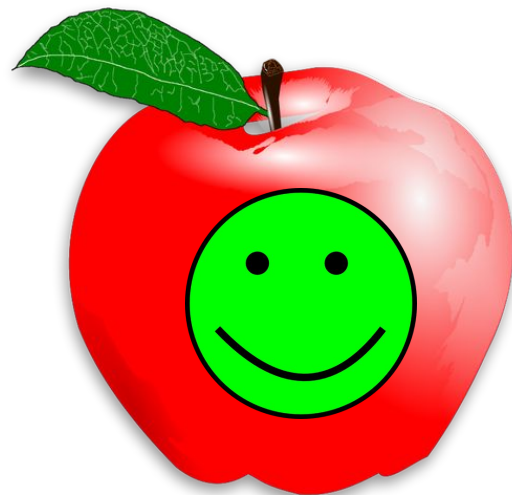
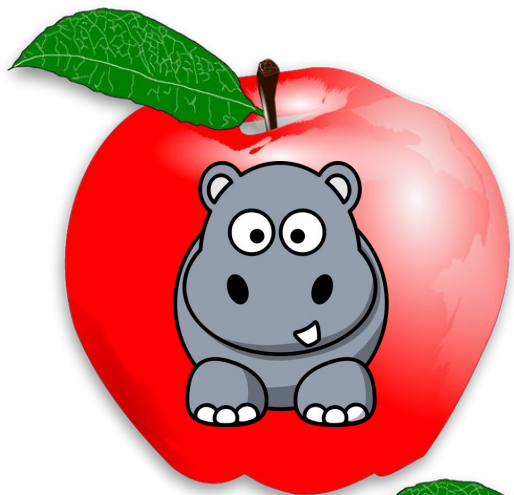
