Early Ed Science Lesson: 4/10/2020

Learning Target:

Students will use their sense of hearing to identify sounds in the environment.

Let's Get Started:

Watch Video: Guess that Sound

Practice:

Point to each item and make the sound the item would make. Ex: Car says "Vroooommm"











Activity:

What Can That Sound Be?

Materials needed: Paper, Pencil

- 1. Sing to the tune of "Oh, Dear! What Can the Matter Be?" (Ex: Tune)
 - "Oh, dear! What can that sound be?"
 - "Oh, dear! What can that sound be?"
 - "Oh dear! What can that sound be?"
 - "Let's listen closely and hear."
- 2. Encourage children to listen very closely and identify any sounds they may hear. Do you hear voices in the kitchen, dogs barking, cars in the neighborhood, siblings laughing etc.
- 3. For children who are still working on their language skills, name and describe the word/sound to them.
- 4. Invite your 2 year old friends to draw a picture of what they are hearing.

Another way to play is doing animal sounds with songs and masks. Use the classic animal song that toddlers love--Old Macdonald. It has a great tune and animal sounds and kids love it because it is repetitive--have them sing-a-long and then make a mask of their favorite animal!
