Early Education Thunderstorm in a Cup April 29, 2020



Pre-K Literacy Lesson: 04/29/2020

Learning Target: Students will observe and explore how clouds rain.

Let's Get Started:

Watch Video: <u>Sid the Science Kid's "Where Does Rain Come</u> <u>From?"</u>

Practice:

Which items do you wear or use when it's raining?



Activity:

Thunderstorm in a Cup

Materials needed: Tall clear cup, shaving cream, paper clip, and blue food coloring

- 1. Watch this video to set activity up: <u>How to Make a Rain Cloud in a Jar</u>
- 2. Questions to ask:
 - a. What happens when water vapors come together? (clouds form)
 - b. What happens when more water vapors keep coming together? (it rains)
 - c. What does the paperclip look like? (lightning)
- 3. Explain: frozen water in the clouds bump into each other and cause electrical charges. The electrical charge turns into lighting.
