




Do you celebrate St. Patrick's Day at home or in school? How have you seen people celebrate the holiday?

Clues.

What does the word romped mean?



Clue #1- I know yards are outside, so I know the dog is outside.

Clue #2- I know that dogs play outside.

If a dog is playing outside, **romped** probably means playing energetically.



The children were **chided** by their parents when they got into the cookie jar without permission.

What does the word chided mean?

Clue #1- I know that without permission means that the children should not be in the cookie jar.

Clue #2- If I got a cookie without permission, I would get in trouble.

Chided probably means to get in trouble.

The girl was **considerate**, she was kind to help her friend when she fell off of her bike.

What does the word considerate mean?

Clue #1- I know that kind means nice.

Clue #2- I know that the girl is helpful.

Considerate probably means kind and helpful.

Unlike my parents who love classical music, I detest it.

What does the word detest mean?
