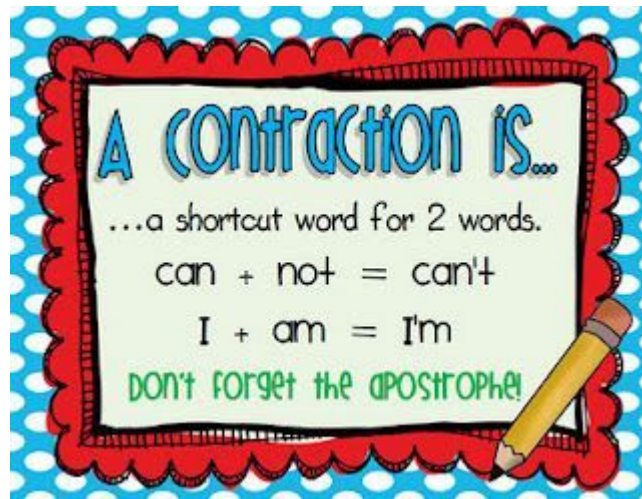

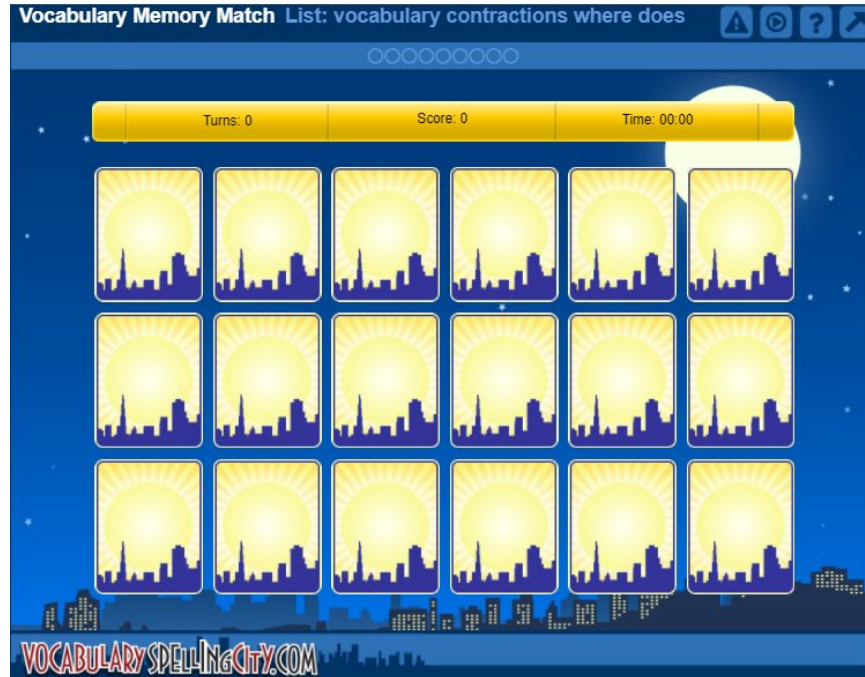

What is a Contraction Word?

A contraction is a shortened form of two words, often a pronoun and a verb (*I + am = I'm*) or a verb and the word not (*is + not = isn't*), where an apostrophe takes the place of the missing letter or letters.
