Capitalization Rules



In addition to capitalizing the first word of a sentence, you should also capitalize these things:

Proper Nouns

Capitalize specific names of people or locations.



My cousin **Jenny** and I went to the **Main Street Library**.

Dates

Capitalize the days of the week and months of the year.



It is **Friday, March 3rd**.

Always capitalize the word "I."



Someday, when **I** am a grown up, **I** will be a baseball player.
