


State Capitol Building Jefferson City, Missouri



Missouri Governor's Mansion Jefferson City, Missouri


Practice #5: Where are the Mississippi and Missouri Rivers?


- 1. Select "Launch Earth".

- 4. You can also explore by typing in specific attractions like the Capitol Building, Governor's Mansion, and the Gateway Arch.




