

Practice #1

An inference is based on reasoning and evidence.

- Look for clues in pictures and/or text.
- Words to use when you infer: I think...
 Linfer...

What inference can you make about Brian?

How did the author/illustrator help to make the meaning clear?



Possible Answers to Practice #1

- I think Brian is kind because he wrote a nice note to the new student.
- I infer Brian feels sad because he is sitting all alone eating lunch.
- The illustrator made this clear showing Brian in black and white when he was sad or left out and then in color when he was happy.

Practice #2

Think back to the video. Helpful questions:

- What did the character learn?
- How did the character grow or change?

Decide what the theme of <u>The</u> <u>Invisible Boy</u> is. Include evidence from the story to support your thinking.

Commighted Material

Possible Answers to Practice #2

- The theme of <u>The Invisible Boy</u> is acceptance of others. Brian is different than his peers, and feels invisible because no one accepts him until the new boy, Justin comes.
- The theme of <u>The Invisible Boy</u> is friendship. Brian makes a friend after writing an encouraging note to the new student, Justin. Once he makes a friend, he begins to feel happy.

Practice #3

Think back to the video.

 Use adjectives to describe characters. Name three character traits that describe who Brian is on the inside. Provide evidence from the story to support your answer.



Possible answers to Practice #3

Character Trait

- 1. shy/quiet
- 2. kind

3. artistic


<u>Evidence</u>

- 1. Brian doesn't say a lot in the story
- 2. He left Justin a note and a drawing to cheer him up
- 3. Brian draws pictures for his group project
