4th Grade Music Lesson: April 7, 2020

Learning Target: Students will read notes on the lines and spaces of the treble clef.

Background: This is a review of pitches on the treble clef.

- Students learn to identify notes by placement on lines or spaces in 1st grade via solfege (for example, so and mi)
- Students learn pitch letter names in 4th grade


Let's Get Started:

Practice #1: What pitch is the note on the third line?

Remember, the notes are the first letters of the phrase "Every Good Boy Does Fine" going from the bottom to the top.



Practice #2: What pitch is the note on the second line?

Remember, the notes are the first letters of the phrase "Every Good Boy Does Fine" going from the bottom to the top.





Practice #3:

What pitch is the note on the second space?

Remember, the notes spell "FACE in the space" going from the bottom to the top.


Music Teacher's Games: Treble Note Names

- 3. Look in the score box to see how you are doing. Correct answers increase points, incorrect answers decrease points.
