4th Grade Social Studies Lesson: April 10th, 2020

Learning Target:

Students will locate and describe the <u>Northeast</u> region of the United States.

Background:

This is a review lesson from Quarter 1 of Fourth Grade.

- In 2nd grade, students learn to read and construct maps.
- In 3rd grade, students learn to identify major cities, rivers, and regions of Missouri.
- In 4th grade, students learn to name and locate specific regions, states, capitals, river systems, and mountain ranges in the U.S.


Let's get started!

You have learned so much about the **5 regions of the United States!**


Today, you will learn about one more region: The Northeast.


To begin, take a look at <u>The Eastern</u> <u>United States</u> video. This short clip teaches about the Northeast *and* reviews info about the Southeast.

After that, watch the **NE Video!**





1. Which number marks the **Northeast** region of the U.S. on the map?





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
- 2. What does it mean when we say that the Northeast is, "the most densely populated region in the U.S."?

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- b. The region is small, and not very many people live there.
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This is New York City, which is in the Northeast region. About 9 million people live in this one city!

2. What does it mean when we say that the Northeast is, "the most <u>densely populated</u> region in the U.S."?

Remember, "population"
means the number of
people that live
somewhere. A "dense
population" would mean
that many people live in
a small area.




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Use the map to answer the following:


Click the images to explore landmarks, parks, cities, and other awesome features of the Northeast region! Choose at least 3 features to click and read about from each.

New England states + Mid-Atlantic states = Northeast Region




New England states
