#### Learning Target

Students will layer materials to create a relief.

# Materials needed in this lesson:

- Glue (Stick, bottled, any kind will work)
- Scissors
- Empty Snack Boxes (Cereal boxes, granola bar boxes, oatmeal boxes, anything that is a bit thicker than paper, cardboard)

# **Optional Materials:**

- Crayons with wrapper removed
- Foil
- Markers
- Paint and brushes

# Background: This is a review lesson from 4th Grade

# Let's Get Started

**Relief** is where the sculpted elements remain attached to a solid background of the same material. The term **relief** is from the Latin verb relevo, to raise.

This one is a relief

Imagine you were holding this art piece and were able to put your hand across it. What would it feel like? Remember that it is NOT flat.



What areas of this relief are coming out? What areas are carved in?

Examples of additive (coming out of the image): Ear, creases around eye, earring

Examples of subtractive (carved in): Hair, Hat design, nostrils
