### 6th Grade ELA Lesson: May 14, 2020 Objectives/Learning Targets:

#### Students will:

- focus on the difference between quoting a source and paraphrasing the source's words.
- write responses using complete sentences with standard spelling, punctuation, and grammar.

#### Sample Proficient Answer: (Answers may vary)

Alex is saying that people just need to get involved in order to help solve a problem. It doesn't matter where you start; it's more about taking action.

#### The Difference Between Quoting and Paraphrasing

Quoting	Paraphrasing
Using the author's own words. This should be indicated using quotation marks.	Presenting information from the original author's work but with significant change in wording and structure of information.
Quotation marks ("") are a type of punctuation used to mark exact words.	Paraphrasing focuses on IDEAS not words.

Using the following quote, paraphrase (put into your own words) what Marley was talking about.

## **Practice Answer Key**

"The biggest thing that has disturbed me are these social structures and infrastructures in schools and communities that are pushing away from intersectionality; where a person can be a girl and also a black person. I need to be included in both of those realities; not just one or the other."

Sample Proficient Answer: (answers may vary) Marley is saying that she wants to read books about being both a black person AND a girl. She feels like society tries to separate those pieces and she wants to read about being a black girl; not just being black OR being a girl. I used a quote here from Marley.
