
What is a pronoun and how can I identify them in a text?

Warm-Up:


Review: Pronouns take the place of nouns to name persons, places, things, or ideas.






Remember, a pronoun takes the place of a noun.

An antecedent is the noun that the pronoun replaces.






Learn

There are many different types of pronouns. Some are:

- PERSONAL PRONOUNS is a short word we use as a simple substitute for the proper name of a person:
- I, me, you, he, him, she, her, it, we, us, they, them
 - POSSESSIVE PERSONAL PRONOUNS replace a noun and show ownership:
- my, mine, your, yours, his, her, hers, its, our, ours, their, theirs
 - Remember: There are no apostrophes used with possessive personal pronouns. It's stands for the contraction that represents "It is" or "It has." It's is NEVER possessive.
