

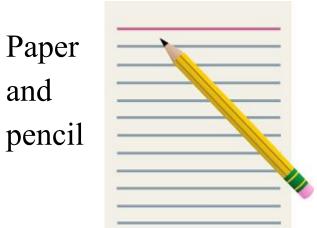








Activity 2: Essay (example, part 1)

I would like to visit Ancient Rome. Ancient Rome was in Italy. It was protected by Alps to the north. The Tiber river runs from the Apennine mountains through Rome. Ancient Rome's government was a republic, similar to the United States, but then became a monarchy when Augustus became Emperor. The Romans were polytheistic. Most of their gods were copies of the Ancient Greek gods. The Romans were amazing engineers. They built roads all over Europe as they expanded the Empire. They also invented many new things. My favorite is the first known fast food restaurant, called a thermopolia, in the city of Pompeii.

Ancient Rome had large Latifundium that were similar to plantations in the southern U.S. They used slave labor to grow crops and raise livestock. A slave could save money and eventually buy their freedom.






Activity 2: Essay (example, part 2)

The Romans also had many large cities. Many people in the cities were shop owners, craftspeople, or traders. Some were even great entertainers, like the gladiators. Anyone who wasn't born to a noble family could become a citizen by paying a large citizen tax or joining the army. Joining the army was very honorable. The army built most of the roads as well as a lot of forts that would eventually become new cities.

Roman Emperors built large temples and places for entertainment so that they would be remembered after they died. One of the biggest is the Colosseum in Rome. This was the home of the greatest gladiators. Gladiators fought duels against each other. They had special weapons and armor that went with their character. Gladiators could become so famous that they became superstars. The most famous ones even sold their sweat as perfume. Eww gross. Although it was a dangerous job, the


