



Learn:



Sample Proficient Answer:

- 1.) Rita Pierson states that "Every child needs a champion" by this she means students need teachers and staff who care about them and are willing to invest in them as people. Students want adults who can help them become "the best they can possibly be." This means that students want to be taught by educators who are willing to invest their time and energy into each of their students. In addition, students want their teachers to get to know them as individuals, not just as kids sitting in their classes.
- 2.) "No significant learning occurs without a significant relationship." Rita Pierson quotes James Comer in her TedTalk as she explains why students want teachers who are willing to invest their time and energy into them. Students can intuit when teachers aren't listening to them or don't really care. When students know and see that their teachers care, they are more willing to work hare and invest their time in that class.
