Author's use thoughtful word choice to develop meaning and establish theme in their writing.


LEARN: Identifying Theme(LINK)

Theme is the **central** message expressed in a story.

- •A stated theme is expressed directly by the author.
- An <u>implied</u> theme is suggested, or state indirectly through what happens to the characters.
- A <u>universal</u> theme, or a recurring theme, is a message about life that is expressed regularly in many different cultures and time periods

•The theme is a **sentence or phrase**, it is NOT a word!!!

Authors use word choice to help develop their theme.



Learning Continued ... examples of a theme statement.

Example #1: The children's book, The Lorax, by Dr. Seuss is about loyalty to others and reveals that it is important to stand up for those that can't stand up for themselves.

Example #2: In the young adult fiction series the book Among the Hidden, by Margaret Peterson Haddix presents the idea that you should stand up for what you believe in, even if it costs you your life.

Example of Independent Work

Example Answer:

The theme of "The Dinner Party" is your gender has no impact on how courageous you are. The story begins with two people arguing about women's abilities to remain calm in the face of fear. Later when a man believes there may be a cobra in the room, the author states, "His first impulse is to jump back and warn the others, but he knows the commotion would frighten the cobra into striking. He speaks quickly, the tone of his voice so arresting that it sobers everyone." Then after the cobra appears and leaves the room, the man asks the hostess how she knew there was a cobra in the room. She replies, "Because it was crawling across my foot." She had made no movements or screams although she must have been scared. In both cases, the individuals showed calm in the face of fear. This proves the theme that gender has no impact on how courageous you are.
