- *backstory Royals' record
- *More details:
 - name of stadium
 - player stats
 - specific plays
 - reviewed games 1-4

*This paragraph should be anywhere from 6-10 sentences long.



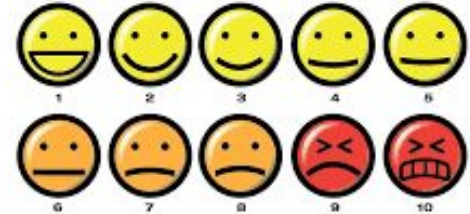

Suggested Answers: PRACTICE WITH INDEPENDENT WORK

On a scale of 1-10 I would rank the article as a 7 and the video as a 9. I give the article a 7 because I didn't like how it told the story out of sequence. Furthermore, I like having things laid out in chronological order so I can really paint a picture of the whole situation in my mind. I gave the video a 9 mainly because the announcers and the roar of the crowd got louder and more excited each time the Royals did something to help their team. Moreover, this helped build a sense of tension and suspense which only made the excitement of finally winning fantastic. However, I did like how article gave more details about the team's history and the stats for individual players. Overall, even though I appreciated the extra details given in the article, I realize that I am a very visual learner, meaning I understand things better if I can "see" what's going on.
