# Composition and Reading 2: Critical Analysis Final Draft (2 of 2) May 22, 2020



# **Objective/Learning Target:**

Students will apply critical analysis and writing skills to revise and format an analysis of a chosen short story.



#### Answer the following questions in your notebook. Starting Question(s):

- 1. Do you feel as though you are done with your paper?
- 2. How does one format a paper to meet MLA requirements?
- 3. What is a proper header for an MLA formatted paper?



#### Learn:

By this point, you might be done! Hooray for you! But have we formatted the paper correctly? Just like in your annotated bibliography, your critical analysis paper should be formatted using MLA rules. To start, make sure everything is double-spaced. Highlight the whole paper, then go to Format-->Line Spacing $\rightarrow$  then click "double."



#### Learn:

Next, make sure you have your works cited page all figured out! It should look almost exactly like your annotated bibliography, except you don't need the annotations! Use the MLA citations that you have already created and place them on a separate page below the end of your paper.



#### Learn:

Next you will need a header on the first page. On the left side of your paper, above everything that you have written, type your first and last name, hit enter, the name of your teacher (in this case Mr. Huber), hit enter, type the name of the course (Composition and Reading II), hit enter, and then type the due date (22 May 2020). So it will look like this: Thomas Anderson

Mr. Huber

Composition and Reading II

22 May 2020



#### Learn:

Lastly, you will need your last name and page number on every subsequent page. To do this, click on Format in the toolbar $\rightarrow$  then click on Page numbers  $\rightarrow$  This will open an option box. A box will be checked that says "Display on first page". **Unclick this checkbox. You do not need your last name and page number on the first page of your paper.**  $\rightarrow$ Click apply, and this will put a page number on every page. In front of this page number, type your last name. This will make your last name and page number appear on every page!
