Congratulations! If you completed the bell work, you understand how various media formats can portray ideas and topics in different ways.

A **media format** is particular way information is stored and presented. There are four general types, which are listed with examples below.

Images	Video	Audio	Text
Photographs Memes	Movies GIFs TV shows	Music Podcasts	Books News Articles Poetry



LEARN

Certain media formats can portray a single topic or idea in completely different ways. Some might be able to communicate the idea more clearly or create a particular effect for the audience. Let's say you're creating a public service announcement about stray animals. Which of the media formats below has a stronger *emotional impact*? Which one provides *more information*? Both formats are effective depending on the author's purpose.

How do these two formats differ in their handling of the topic (causes of behavior)? Which format do you think would engage and inform an audience more for this topic? Why?

"What Does the Mind of a Killer Look Like" and "You Are Shaped by the Genes You Inherit" differ in how they establish a tone. The podcast establishes its tone by placing chilling sound effects after the narrator says the phrase "examine the brains of serial killers" (1:04). The article establishes its tone through word choice, specifically, "DNA sequencing", "genetic tracking", and "variation" (Zimmer, page 2). The podcast's sound effects create an eerie tone while the article's word choice establishes a formal, scientific tone. The format that is most engaging and informative for the audience is the podcasts because it still delivers a great deal of information while holding the audience's interest with sound effects and music.
