
Objective/Learning Target:

- 1. What are some of the advantages the article has in providing information?
- 2. Are there any advantages the video has in providing information?
- 3. Which medium was more effective in informing the audience about procrastination?

- Answered each question in your response
- Gave an example for the article and the video
- Explained why the examples are advantages
- Explained why one medium is more effective than the other



Example of a Proficient Answer

(answers will vary)

The article and the video each have their own advantages when providing information about procrastination. An advantage the article has is how the text is divided into sections. This helps break the flow of the text and clues the reader in on what the next section is going to address. The video has the advantage of using visuals to convey the information in additional to the presenter speaking. The visuals help reinforce what is being said. Due to the ability to present information both visually and audibly, the video is more effective at conveying information that the article.
