
If you already have an individual reading book, you are welcome to use that one.

Practice:

Check out an online book or use a book you have.

- On notebook paper, answer the following questions about your book. (Save the paper for future use with this book)
 - 1. What is the title of your book?
 - 2. Who is the author of your book?
 - 3. Why did you choose this particular book(What are you looking forward to in this book?)

Practice Answer Key:

(Answers will Vary)

- Check your answers to make sure it meets the following criteria:
 - \rightarrow Did you write in complete sentences?
 - \rightarrow Did you use standard conventions (spelling, punctuation, grammar)?
 - \rightarrow Did you answer the question?

Sample Proficient Answers:

- 1. The title of my book is <u>The Stationery Shop</u>.
- 2. The author of <u>The Stationery Shop</u> is Marjan Kamali.
- 3. I chose this book because a friend recommended it to me. I am looking forward to this book because it is set in Tehran, a culture with which I am not familiar. It's a romance book, something I don't ordinarily read, but it sounds interesting.
