Objective/Learning Target: I can use prefixes to help determine word meaning in text.





PREFIXES IN ENGLISH





Sometimes when trying to figure out the meaning of new words, it is helpful to look at the different parts of a word to help you.

A PREFIX comes at the beginning of a word and can change the meaning of the root word.

This chart has just some of the most common prefixes.


