Summarizing Review



Remember, to help readers **summarize** what they have read you need to think about the **plot** of a story.

Plot = the structure and events that make up of a story.



Turning Your Summary into a Book

Do you know what a Book Talk is?

A Book Talk is when you tell an audience about your book by giving them a quick summary.

However, you don't want to give away the ending! You want to make your audience want to read it to find out the ending! a book talk is more of an advertisement or a commercial.

Answer these questions about a book you have finished reading!

- What is the Title?
- Who is the Author?
- What genre is your book?
- Who are the the main characters?
- Where does the story take place?
- What is the major problem (conflict) your character faces?
- Provide a brief overview of the plot (remember to only hint at, but do NOT reveal, the climax or resolution of the story).
- Why you like it and to who should read this book?



Answer Example

- What is the Title? <u>Among the Hidden</u>
- Who is the Author? Margaret Peterson Haddix
- What genre is your book? Fiction
- Who are the main characters? Luke, Jen, Garner Family
- Where does the story take place? At the Talbot Home & Garner Home
- What is the major problem (conflict) your character faces? Luke is a third child and it is illegal for families to have three children.
- Provide a brief overview of the plot (remember to only hint at, but do NOT reveal, the climax or resolution of the story). Jen is also a third child and believes third children should have the same freedom as other children. She plans a rally to storm the capitol.
- Why you like it and to who should read this book? Anyone who likes a book that keeps you guessing what will happen next!
