#### **Objective/Learning Target:**

Students will be able to identify adjective phrases in writing

## **Bell Ringer**

Being as descriptive as possible, how would you describe your dream house?





## Lesson/Activity

Adjectives are words that are used to describe a noun as seen in the examples below.

- The <u>red</u> ball bounced down the street.
- The cat's <u>bright</u> eyes could be seen in the dark.

An adjective phrase is a group of words headed by an adjective that modifies a noun.



## Lesson/Activity

Each of the following sentences have the adjective phrases highlighted.

- She had extremely menacing eyes.
  - Notice how the adjective phrase is modifying the noun "eyes"
- She wore very expensive shoes.
  - In this case, the adjective phrase modifies "shoes"
- Sarah was hostile towards me
  - In this instance, the adjective phrase comes after the noun it is modifying

Identify the adjective phrase and the noun it modifies in each of the sentences below

- 1. An overly sensitive heart is an unhappy possession on this shaky earth.
- 2. I'm a fairly intelligent person, but I don't think my grades reflected that.

- 5. Everyone was extremely delighted when the winner was announced.

Adjective phrase is highlighted, the modified noun is underlined
