How did public opinion about the Vietnam War change from what it was in the beginning of the war to later years of the conflict due in large part to television?

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
The television correspondents were on the battlefield when the U.S. troops landed in Vietnam and the public opinion was a positive when in the American public's eye because the media portrayed the U.S. military in a positive light but after about a year into the conflict the television correspondents on the ground portrayed the U.S. military in a negative light and showed footage on the news as to what was really going on and it it changed the public opinion of the American public to a negative one.
