Sociology Lesson: April 15, 2020

Objective/Learning Target: Evaluate the significance of the polio vaccine and the work that researchers such as Dr. Jonas Salk had on safeguarding Americans in the 1950's

Bell Ringer:

On a seperate piece of paper, answer the following question: How can vaccinations and immunizations change society and shape the world we live in?

Lesson Activity:

Dr. Jonas Salk was an American physician who began testing a vaccine on children in 1954 that he began perfecting in 1947. This vaccine would eradicate the most feared scourge of the time, a virus known as paralytic poliomyelitis; more commonly known as polio.
