American History Lesson 12: April 7th 2020

Learning Target: Students should be able to explain the rise and fall of Senator Joseph McCarthy following the rise of the new Communist regime in China and the United States entering the Korean War and how it changed public opinion in the United States.

Questions to Consider

1. How did the rise of Communism in China and the start of the Korean War help to instill fear in the minds of citizens of the United States?

People just started to jump to conclusions without researching what was going on and when you had Hollywood actors/actresses and prominent political leaders giving their answers it instilled fear in the eyes of many Americans all the way through the Cold War era which ended in 1989. 2. Were the actions by Senator Joseph McCarthy an infringement on the Constitutional Rights of U.S. citizens or were his actions justified in an attempt to protect the U.S.?

Yes, they were an infringement on people's Constitutional Rights because he was just calling out people in the government with no knowledge or evidence that they had an ties to Communism. He could never give a straight answer as to how many people were on his Communist list. This is a major contributing factor that led to his downfall.
