# **Lesson Activity**

Since we have been out of school, stay-at-home orders are continually being issued by state governors. With so many quarantined and working from home, one can expect Netflix and other online services to rise in viewership. Just looking at the graph on the right, websites and app viewership has risen.

Ask yourself- how will Netflix be impacted by COVID-19? Are/Were they prepared? Economically, will increased viewership lead to growth and success?

## **Practice Answers**

- 1. How has the pandemic impacted Netflix economically?
  - a. Production has halted on all shows/movies internationally. They have been paid 2 weeks, but it is getting close to being up.
- 2. How has Netflix adapted new ways to reach viewers? Any new ideas?
  - a. Netflix table reads, streaming Netflix Party.
- 3. Detail "traffic" of Netflix since stay-at-home orders began being issued in the US
  - a. Netflix viewership has peaked in the last two weeks, mostly after stay-at-home orders were issued.
- 4. How has Netflix done in the stock market since COVID-19? Is this surprising?
  - Risen 20% while the Dow Jones (stock market) has gone down significantly.
