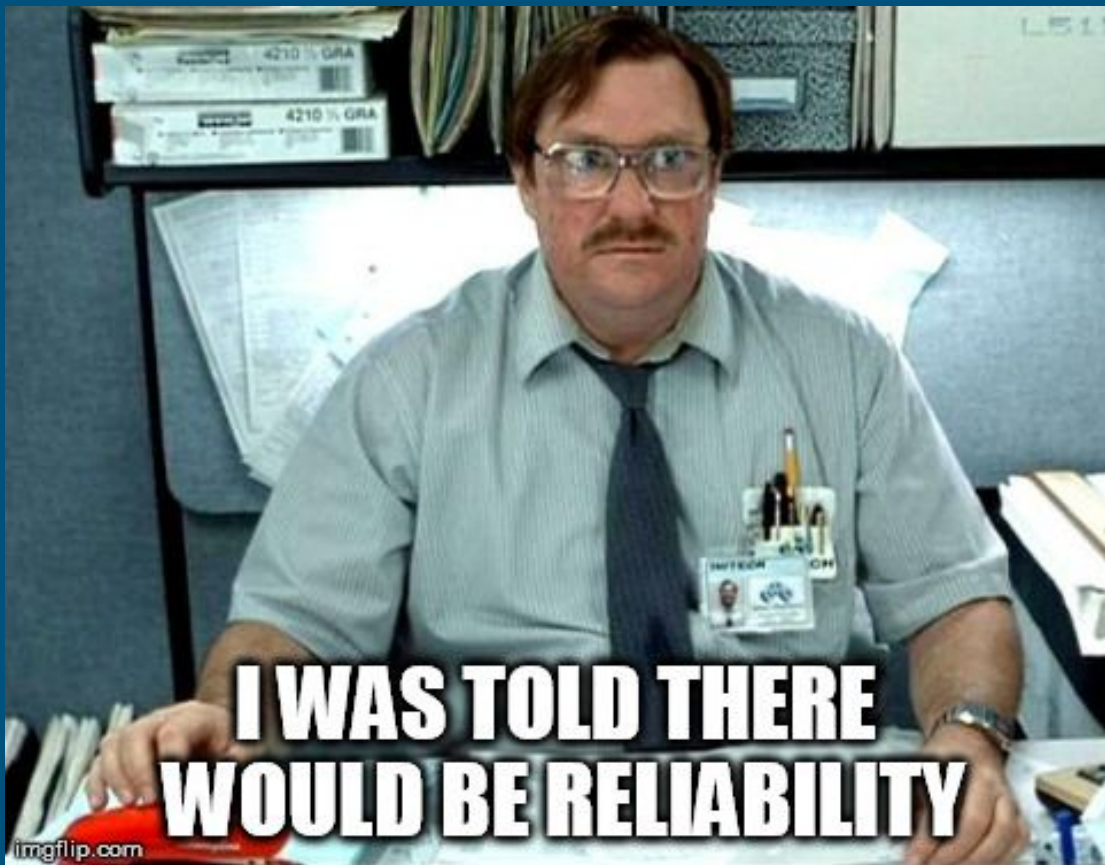

Warm Up Answers

1. “How to Protect Yourself Against COVID-19”

a. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>

b. This is a **RELIABLE** source. Notice the .gov and the facts mentioned in the article. At the bottom, the last day reviewed/edited was March 18, 2020, therefore the information is current.

2. “These 46 Rare Historical Photos Will Leave You Speechless. #35 Is Mind Blowing.

a. <https://boredomtherapy.com/rare-history-photos/>

b. This is an **UNRELIABLE** source. Notice the title enticing the reader to continue looking through pictures. These pictures are an example of clickbait (aimed to draw viewership on emotion rather than facts.)

3. “What is the Truth Behind Carole Baskin?”

a. https://www.reddit.com/r/TrueCrimeDiscussion/comments/fqg2u5/what_is_the_truth_behind_carole_baskin/

b. This is an **UNRELIABLE SOURCE**. Notice the article came from reddit and allows viewers to post opinions and others to comment.
