## Introduction to Abnormal Psychology Lesson: 16 April 13, 2020

Objective/Learning Target: The student will be able to define psychologically abnormal behavior.

# Warm Up



# **Lesson Activity**

One simple way to describe Abnormal Psychology is that it is the scientific study of abnormal behavior in order to describe, predict, explain, and change abnormal patterns of functioning.

#### But what is Abnormal Behavior?



Abnormal behavior is generally defined as "behavior that violates a norm in society, is maladaptive, is rare given the context of the culture and environment, and is causing the person distress in their daily life." - Diagnostic & Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders - 5th Edition (DSM-5)

The DSM-5 is a handbook used by mental health professionals containing descriptions, symptoms, and other criteria for diagnosing mental disorders.

The current edition was published in 2013.

# **Lesson Activity**

What makes a behavior a mental illness?

- Many definitions have been proposed, yet none are accepted everywhere.
- Most definitions share some common features.

#### The 4 D's of Mental Disorders:

- 1. **Deviance** → different, extreme, unusual
- 2. **Distress**  $\rightarrow$  unpleasant & upsetting to the person with the disorder
- 3. **Dysfunction**  $\rightarrow$  causes interference with the person's daily life
- 4. **Danger**  $\rightarrow$  poses risk of harm to themselves or others

### **Practice**

Click on the link to read an article about an eating disorder known as Pica. The article also includes the diagnostic criteria for Pica from the DSM-5. As you are reading everything from the article, try to connect the 4 D's to what you're reading. Does it address all 4 or are there some that it doesn't address?

### Practice - ANSWER KEY

Use the Answer Key on the right to check your responses.

Article: Pica (Theravive.com)

- 1. How is Pica deviant?
  - People with Pica eat things that provide no nutritional value like hair, paper, nails, glass, etc. which is unusual or extreme.
- 2. How does it cause the patient *distress*?
  - a. Patients know what they're doing isn't good for them and would like to stop but feel unable to which can lead to other issues.
- 3. How does Pica cause *dysfunction* in the patient's life?
  - Instead of eating things they should, patients are constantly drawn to eating things they shouldn't making it difficult to go about leading a normal life.
- 4. Why/how is Pica dangerous?
  - Eating non-nutritive objects can cause the patient to choke, damage teeth/throat/internal organs/etc., and cause blockages...all of which could lead to serious injury or death.

### Reflection

Abnormal Psychology is the branch of psychology that deals with the description, causes, and treatment of abnormal behavior patterns and mental disorders/illness.

Almost all mental disorders have 4 things in common: Deviance, Distress, Dysfunction, Danger.
