High School/Lesson 25 Coronavirus through the **Sociological Perspectives April 24, 2020**



Sociology

Lesson: April 24th, 2020

Objective/Learning Target: The student will be able to explain the Corona Virus and its effects on society through the lens of the three sociological perspectives.

Warm Up:

On a separate piece of paper, write down in your own words what you think will change about society because of the Coronavirus. For instance: I believe the institution of education might change and become more technologically advanced because of the Coronavirus.

Essential Vocabulary:

Functionalism: the approach in sociology that emphasizes the contributions made by each part of society.

Conflict perspective: the approach in sociology that emphasizes the role of conflict, competition, and constraint within a society.

Symbolic Interactionism: the approach in sociology that focuses on the interactions among people based on mutually understood symbols.

Lesson/Activity:

Functionalism stresses that all parts of society must work together much like the parts of the body must work together. It emphasizes cooperation among the different groups within a society. A change in one part of society will lead to a change in another. For example: a major change in the economy might create major changes for the family.

Lesson/Activity

Conflict perspective concentrates on the role played by conflict, constraint, and competition and how a society changes and grows as a result of this. For instance, the threat of war has lead to many advancements from nuclear energy and weapons advancement, all the way to the invention of the internet. Remember: the cliche "Iron sharpens iron" is a great example of how to think about Conflict perspective

Lesson/Activity:

Symbolic Interactionism is a little more abstract than the others. It focuses on the interactions among people based on mutually understood symbols. The meaning of a symbol is not determined by its own physical characteristics. Those who create and use the symbols assign the meanings to them. If the people in a group do not share the same meanings for a symbol, confusion results. For example, if some people interpreted the red light of a traffic signal to mean go, and some people interpreted it to mean stop, chaos would result.
