We often use the word "Culture" and "Society" interchangeably. However, they actually have two very different meanings. What do you think they have in common and how do you think they are different?

What is Culture?

- Culture is the knowledge, language, values, customs, and physical objects that are passed from generation to generation among members of a group.
- Simply put: "way of life."
- Culture is alive and is always changing.
 - Slavery was a major part of culture for many years while it's abolished now.
 - Cell phones weren't a part of our culture until the last couple of decades...now they're a huge part!
 - In another 20 years, who knows what we will have that we don't have now!
