
The Suez Canal

Built in 1869, as an artificial waterway allowing easier trade and travel between Europe and Middle East (connects Red Sea to Mediterranean Sea)

British and French owned canal; wanted protection of this strategic waterway, since trade and travel via the canal brought profit

much of the world's oil was transported through this canal




Suez Crisis

- Oct 1956 <u>Suez Crisis</u>
 - cause
 - » Egypt's decision to nationalize and close the Suez Canal
 - » European countries had economic and trading interest in the Suez Canal
 - » Israel wanted to reopen the canal for Israeli shipping
 - Israel invades Egypt's Sinai Peninsula with the support of France and Britain
- Mar 1957 withdrawl of Israeli forces from the Sinai Peninsula – end of the Suez Crisis
