Make sure you are showing your skill set in what ever material you are working with and the composition is solid. Follow the same criteria as you normally would on the score guides for each final piece produced.

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**Bell Ringer:**

**Thursday-** Is the work ordered/balanced? Or chaotic/disturbing? What makes for the order or chaos? Would you use words such as unity, variety, contrast, balance, movement, and rhythm to describe characteristics of this work? Drawing-explain your mark making process (realistic? Broken? Fluid? Varied? etc)

**Task #1:** student is to do their art in their sustained investigation. 30-45 min work time.

**Task #2:** For students taking the exam

1. Those submitting for AP exam make sure you are uploading your finished images to **apstudio.ets.org** as best you can if you have them. After taking pic on your cellphone (those doing non digital or photos) you may edit the image by cropping, adjusting exposure so it looks like what you see in the real world. If you do other alterations in an editing program you must call the work mixed media.
2. I have sent to those enrolled to take the exam an email with what work I could get quickly. I have also saved some digital work to a google share folder-all work was flattened and saved as JPEG ready to upload to the **apstudio.ets.org** site/location you save work to-the one I had everyone make an acct for, remember?
