

Task # 3: Continue to post all completed work to AP Studio Art digital submission site

With the new revised submission you need to upload at minimum 10 sustained investigation images (they have kept all 15 slides in the site-just use at least 10 of them)

You will also need to upload at least your <u>3 best pieces of art work "Selected Works"</u>, It is across the top of the screen.

Marbleize paper for backgrounds

You would need a tub of water, chalk, a plastic knife.

## **Example if you cannot access the link above:**

Step 1 : Supplies: chalk, plastic knife, paper and tub of water



Step 3: Gently lay paper on top Of the chalk water.




Step 2: Scrape off chalk into tub Of water, it should float on top-you may use as many different colors as needed but at least have one cool and one warm color option.



Step 4: Carefully take off paper and lay flat to dry. \*\*I used watercolor paper but use what you have.



Step 5: Finishing up. Once marbleized paper is fully dry (0r maybe not if you wish to add more water color or brush colors around-your choice) Draw as you wish.



I used black pens of various widths & copic markers. "Primary Virus" is what I call it.....it suited the mood I was feeling.
