Activities:

Task #1: Submitting to exam students: upload all remaining images onto your on line submission portfolio. Fill in the boxes below each upload.

Task #2:Exam students: If you have blank spots in Sustained Investigation and/or Selected works-upload and put the place holders in those spots (placeholder uploads were emailed to you by me and AP College Board)

Task # 3: Submitting exam students:

** I check the site daily to see who is uploading their images.

With the new revised submission you need to upload at minimum 10 sustained investigation images (they have kept all 15 slides in the site-just use at least 10 of them) And decide on your 3 best art pieces for selected works.

When it asks for your Process, it can include;	you saying you did
sketches, digital mind map, you got inspiration from	, how did you begin to
how you ended up with the piece submitted, I utilized	to explore and
relate to my work.	

When it asks for Materials, make sure you include all the art mediums used in the creation of the particular piece.

Sizing: This can be approximate of the finished piece, digital work it is the size of the printed work.

If using a desktop, the Recommended Browsers and Versions are


Firefox v. 41, Google Chrome v. 45, Safari 8 or below.

- •At this time, we believe that **Internet Explorer** may cause **image distortion** in the uploading process.
 - •All portfolios will be viewed by the College Board Readers using the <u>Chrome browser</u>.
- •All images must be submitted in JPEG format (file name followed by the extension .jpg) and RGB color mode.
- •We recommend uploading files that are 72 pixels-per-inch (ppi) because a higher resolution does not add clarity to images that are being viewed on a computer screen.
- •We recommend that you **keep copies** of your **original** images.
