# **Objective/Learning Target:**

Objective: Student will photograph their <u>best 5 favorite subject matter</u> (same item needs to be seen 5 different ways) and <u>5 least favorite subject matter</u> (same item needs to be seen 5 different ways) shots are displaying that one thing from different view/vantage points. Any light source or lens may be used. Cellphone or regular cameras may be used or combined. Student may edit any way they wish. There will also be <u>1 photo of whatever subject</u> matter/style of your choosing. Student is displaying all knowledge gained from previous lessons with regards to proper exposure, focus, composition, use of light, use of lenses, motion and "seeing" for visual appeal to a viewer. <u>"Show Me What You've Got"</u>

#### Activities:

**Task #1:** Continue taking photos of your favorite subject matter. Take photos from all different points of view.


**Same**/<u>favorite</u> subject matter displayed 5 different ways: There are 5 images of a similar/same/your favorite subject matter shown in a different manner/point of view. Images show creativity in regards to how taken with solid composition for visual appeal to the viewer. You may use any type of lighting or lenses.

**Task #2:** Review the images you have taken. Are these photos better than the previous day? Do you need to re take images or change to a different favorite subject matter?

Task #3: Try a new editing app if you are editing from your cell phone

For example if you like combining images try Bazaart app.

Go to your cellphone app store and search and download the free app Bazaart Photo Editing (if your parents say ok) Ultimate Photo Mixer would be ok too, but this lesson will be used with Bazaart. You can use this app if you like blending photos.

- 1. ADD
- 2. Canvas
- 3. Edit
