High School Drawing II Unit: Mixed Media Surfaces Lesson: Loo Roll Art Challenge



Drawing II Lesson: Loo Roll Art Challenge May 13, 2020

Objective/Learning Target:

Students will choose from a range of materials and methods of contemporary artistic practices to plan works of art and design. Students will collect found surfaces to challenge their drawing techniques and creativity.

Students will create an artwork on new found materials around their homes. Students can share work on social media.



Let's get started:

Artist in quarantine have been exploring different media, inspirations, methods and techniques. In your home you will be collecting materials that you can draw on that differ from your typical drawing paper.

Some artist have drawn on eggs, newspapers, envelopes, pizza boxes, toilet paper rolls, scrap wood, paper/ styrofoam cups, etc. Walk around your home, collect and consider potential surfaces that can use some artistic flair. This collection will be used for next week's lesson of "Unusual Surfaces".

The first experimentation we will work on is toilet paper rolls. Please start collecting. If you absolutely do not have one ready, cut down a cardboard/cereal box to about the size of a toilet paper roll, tape or staple it together.



Based on your collected toilet paper roll(s), start brainstorming what you might need, either as other surfaces to draw on, or what you could draw.

We will start off with a challenge that has been started on social media as a warm up. It is called the "Loo Roll Art Challenge": "Bored in the house, and I'm in the house bored?? When creatives get bored no surface is safe. Try this challenge it's a bit of fun and a great stress reliever. Created by a little gallery in Norfolk called Pinkfoot Gallery"

<u>Today</u>, you will brainstorm, find a reference if needed, maybe draw on a flat surface to practice. You can always do an artist study! Look at Frida!






Tips and Hints:

- 1.) You will need: Loo roll, basic drawing utensils, and possibly an image as reference.
- 2.) If you are struggling for inspiration then you could find an image on the internet or in a book to copy. Once you've got an image in mind, you can draw/paint it straight on to the loo roll or you could draw a light/ rough guide to what you want to draw before starting.
- 3. Don't forget this is a 3D piece of art, your drawing should stretch at least $\frac{2}{3}$ of the way around, if not all the way around! Consider your full composition before you start.
- 4. Don't forget to be resourceful... even with a basic pen you can apply tone and shade with shading techniques. If you want to paint but don't have any paints, you could use tea, or coffee for staining. Even food coloring can be used.

- 2. What inspired your creativity? Did you go for realism or stylistic?
- 3. What difficulties did you have with your loo roll ideas?
- 4. How would you describe your artwork?
- 5. What suggestions would you share if you were to direct a peer on this artwork so far?
- 6. What do you think your weaknesses and strengths are at this point?
- 7. Do you think this helped broaden your scope of materials?
- 8. Have you tried something like this before?
- 9. Did you have difficulty creating something original?
- 10. Did you use a reference? Why or why not?
