Lesson:

Loo Roll Art Challenge

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Objective/Learning Target:

Students will choose from a range of materials and methods of contemporary artistic practices to plan works of art and design.

Students will collect found surfaces to challenge their drawing techniques and creativity.

Students will create an artwork on new found materials around their homes.



Let's get started:

Artist in quarantine have been exploring different media, inspirations, methods and techniques.

In your home you will be collecting materials that you can draw on that differ from your typical drawing paper.

Some artist have drawn on eggs, newspapers, envelopes, pizza boxes, toilet paper and the rolls, scrap wood, and paper/ styrofoam cups.

Walk around your home, collect and consider potential surfaces that can use some artistic flair.

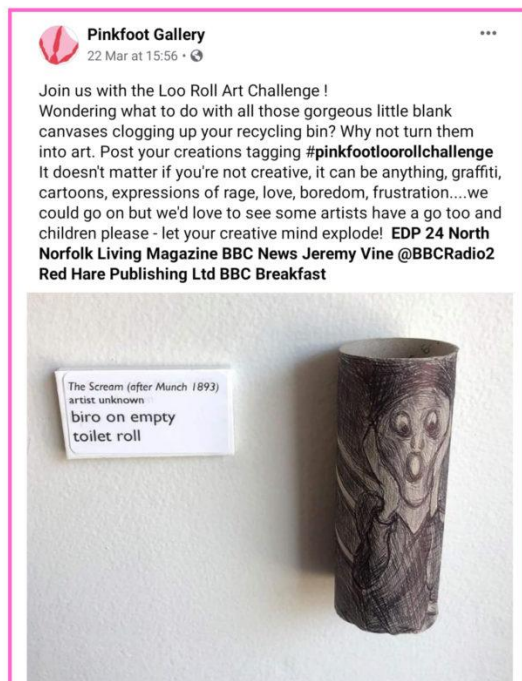
We will be rolling up and finishing up the toilet paper rolls this week. Next week we need supplies!!

Collect some UNUSUAL SURFACES to draw on. You can find things from the list above or venture out to see what else you may have that is not listed.

Activity Lesson:

Today you will do finishing touches on your masterpiece toilet paper roll(s). Remember to include contrast and/or vibrancy to your work.

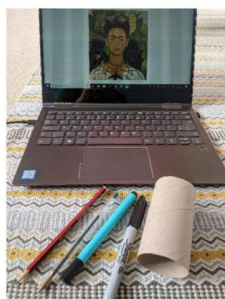


Activity Lesson:

Tips and Hints:

- 1.) You will need: Loo roll, basic drawing utensils, and possibly an image as reference.
- 2.) If you are struggling for inspiration then you could find an image on the internet or in a book to copy. Once you've got an image in mind, you can draw/paint it straight on to the loo roll or you could draw a light / rough guide to what you want to draw before starting.
3. Don't forget this is a 3D piece of art, your drawing should stretch at least $\frac{2}{3}$ of the way around, if not all the way around! Consider your full composition before you start.
4. Don't forget to be resourceful... even with a basic pen you can apply tone and shade with shading techniques. If you want to paint but don't have any paints, you could use tea, or coffee for staining. Even food coloring can be used.

Hints & Tips



1. You will need:
- Loo roll
 - Basic drawing or painting equipment
 - Possibly an image for inspiration



3. Don't forget this is a three-dimensional piece of art, your drawing / painting should stretch at least two thirds of the way around, if not all the way around! Consider your full composition before you start.

2. If you are struggling for inspiration then you could find an image on the internet or in a book to copy.

Once you've got an image in mind, you can draw/paint it straight on to the loo roll or you could draw a light / rough guide to what you want to draw before starting.



4. Don't forget to be resourceful... even with a basic biro pen you can apply tone and shade with cross-hatching. If you want to paint but don't have any paints, what about using tea / coffee for staining or use food colouring?



5. Above all... have **FUN & ENJOY!**
