**Objective:** Students will develop a self-portrait in the form of a playing card. Students will measure and make observations about playing cards in a traditional deck.

**Student Practice:**

1. Start brainstorming! You do not have to depict yourself as “royalty,” but you are required to develop complex patterns in your clothing.
2. If you would like your portrait to have a more stylized look this will be fine. You may also consider morphing your portrait into some kind of animal or something in nature. It can be surreal, have fun with it.
3. Think of hobbies or interests that represent you. This could become the object that you hold in your hand. Use whatever symbols and letters you want for the suit.
4. After determining your suit, pose and the objects that you will be holding, you can take pictures of yourself that you use them for reference. Please draw from these observations.
5. Once you have it drawn on paper then scribble on the back to put lead onto the back side of your drawing. Then you may transfer it to your final canvas and begin the painting process.
6. Use whatever you have available to add some color.
