Bed, Saint (bed' snt) 1753-1755, English history
be-deck (bi dek') vt. to adorn. *The Christmas tree was bedecked with ornaments.*

be-devil (bi dev' al) vt. to be devilled, be devilled, also *British* be-devilled, be devilled. *I got sorry about the plague torment. The business was too much for me. I was devilled to be a doctor.*

be-dew (bi dew' bi dew') vt. to dew, to be dewed, or to be dewed. *The raindrops bedewed the leaves.*

bed-fast (bed' fast) adj. bedridden.
bed-fel-low (bed' fel' o) n. 1. a person who shares a bed with another. 2. a companion or associate. *He acquainted a man with strange bedfellows.*

be-dim (bi dim') vt. to be dimmed, be dimmed, be dimmed, obscure.

be-dizen (bi di' zen, bi di' zen) vt. to bedizen, to bedizen, to adorn gaudily.

bed-lam (bed' lam) n. 1. a state of mind marked by confusion. *It was bedlam at the department store during the sale.* 2. *Archaic* an insane asylum. [A hospital dedicated in the name *Hospital of St. Mary of Bethlehem* was an asylum in London.]

Bed-ouin (bed' o in) n. 1. a member of a large group of wandering Arab nomads who live in the desert regions of North Africa and the Middle East. 2. any wandering or nomad. —adj. of, relating to, or like the Bedouins.

bed-pan (bed' pan') n. a pan used as a toilet by a person who is confined to bed.

bed-post (bed' post') n. one of the vertical supports of the corners of certain beds.

be-drag-gled (bi drag' gld) adj. wet, dirty, and limp. *The kitten was hungry and bedraggled.*

bed-rid-den (bed' rid' an) adj. confined to bed. *Measles kept him bedridden for weeks.*

bed-rock (bed' rik') n. 1. the solid rock that lies under the soil and other loose materials of the earth's surface. 2. a foundation. *The scientist's theory was formed on the rock of truth.* 3. the lowest point or level.

bed-roll (bed' rol') n. a sleeping bag, blankets, or other things that can be rolled up and carried, usually used for sleeping outdoors.

bed-room (bed' room', bed' room') n. a room for sleeping.

bed-side (bed' sid') n. the side of a bed, especially of a person's bed. *He went to his friend's bedside.*

bed-sore (bed' so) n. a sore caused by prolonged pressure against a bed. *People who are bedridden for long periods often get bedsores.*

bed-spread (bed' spred') n. a covering placed on a bed for decoration or protection.

bed-stead (bed' sted') n. a framework that supports the mattress and mattress.

bed-time (bed' tim) n. the time of going to bed. *The child's bedtime was seven o'clock.*

bee (bi) n. any of a group of winged, often stinging insects that have a thick, hairy body and feed on nectar and pollen. Bees are related to wasps and ants. Some bees, such as the honey bee, live in colonies or hives, and thousands of them are kept for honey and beeswax. They make honey. 2. a stinging insect containing a stinger. *She was stung by a bee.*

bee-bread (bi' bred') n. a mixture of pollen and nectar, made by bees to feed their larvae.

beech (bič) n. 1. a tree of a group of trees found in cool or temperate regions of the Northern Hemisphere, having light-colored bark and smooth leaves that may be eaten. 2. the wood of this tree. 3. a tree of the beech tree, used for making wood.

beef (bi) n. 1. the meat of a cow, especially the hindquarters. 2. a cow. 3. a cow's head.

beef-stew (bi' stuw) n. a stew made from beef and vegetables.

beef-steak (bi' stik) n. a slice of beef, especially from the hindquarters, served with sauce.

beef-tenderloin (bi' ten' der lo in) n. a tenderloin of beef.

beef-wellington (bi' wel' ington) n. a beefsteak wrapped in pastry.

beef-wurst (bi' wurst) n. a sausage made from beef.
