Sculpting 1 Material Scavenger Hunt Mr. Bertoncin, Mrs. Flinton, Mrs. Manco Non Objective Sculpture Friday, April 10, 2020

Objective:

- Students will learn how to create a non-objective sculpture using mixed media.
- Students will decorate with color or incorporate patterns and designs.

Non Objective Presentation and Information

Requirements:

Assorted Toilet paper or Paper Towel Tubes Assorted Cardboard or paper Scissors or Exacto-knife (put sheet of cardboard underneath to protect table) Glue or tape Assorted paint, pens and markers Ruler and pencil

Lesson/Activity:

Today we are going to assemble our sculpture and then reflect on what we produced.

Task 1 Establish your base (if you have one). Start building up using cardboard tubes or precut shapes. Consider that this activity is both about making your sculpture pleasing to the eye and a balance within the space.

Task 2 Construction can be done by slitting the cardboard shapes and sliding them together. To connect two tubes you will need to cut only one tube. Cut two slits in it however far you want it to slide on the other tube. It is helpful for slits not to be straight across from each other. It is important to wait for glue to dry.

Task 3 Build, add to it, take pieces off that throw the balance off. If you would like to decorate and paint your sculpture that is optional. If you have spray paint use it outside.

Reflection:

Take a picture of your sculpture from multiple view point and share it using #isddoesart.
