Sculpting 1 Material Scavenger Hunt Mr. Bertoncin, Mrs. Flinton, Mrs. Manco Waste Face Wednesday, April 8, 2020

Objective:

- Students will learn how to create a face using recycled materials.
- Students will decorate the face with color or incorporate patterns and designs.

Bell Ringer/Let's Get Started:

- Where do we see art in our everyday lives?
- What kind of materials do you think artist Vik Munez used to create this interpretation of the Mona Lisa?

Requirements:

Toilet paper or Paper Towel Tubes Small bowl of water (optional) Assorted paint, pens and markers Paper clips and hair dryer (optional)

Lesson/Activity:

After looking at the examples above, make a couple of simple sketches of facial expressions you would like to create. You can make changes as you become familiar with the material you are working with.

Task 1 Take your paper tube and begin pushing in the edges to manipulate the material. If the paper is too difficult to bend you can quickly dip it in water once to allow for the paper to become more flexible.

Task 2 Once your face is complete you can use paper clips and a hair dryer to help the face dry and set in place.

Task 3 Once the face is dry you can decorate the surface using markers, paint, etc. Don't forget to take a picture and share it using #isddoesart. If you enjoyed the process and feel like you could improve on your design, make more!
