Sculpting 1 Material Scavenger Hunt

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Nonobjective Sculpture Thursday, April 9, 2020

Objective:

Students will learn how to plan and assemble a non-objective sculpture using mixed media.

Non Objective Sculpture is a more completely nonrepresentational form that does not even have a starting point in nature. It arises from a constructive manipulation of the sculptor's generalized, abstract ideas of spatial relations, volume, line, color, texture, and so on.

Requirements: Assorted Toilet paper or Paper Towel Tubes Assorted Cardboard or paper Scissors or Exacto knife (put sheet of cardboard underneath to protect table) Glue or tape Assorted paint, pens and markers Ruler and pencil

Lesson/Activity:

Today we are going to learn about non-objective art, which is any art that is not made to reference something. It is non-representational and uses geometric shapes.

Task 1 After looking at the examples above, make a couple of simple sketches of possible designs you would like to create. Consider what kind of shapes you would like to incorporate. If you want to incorporate shapes precut them ahead of time so it will be easier to construct the final composition. The size of your sculpture is up to you. Your Sculpture could sit on a flat surface, hang on a wall or from the ceiling. You can make changes as you become familiar with the material you are working with.

Task 2 After you have finalized your design, begin gathering materials you will need to use. Remember this is a work in progress, tomorrow we will begin constructing your piece. Play some music while you plan and gather materials!
